Are you considering a New Year's Resolution for 2017? Here may be helpful advice from God's Word, Philippians 4: 4-9.

"Be glad in the Lord always! Again I say, be glad! Let your gentleness show in your treatment of all people. The Lord is

near. Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks. Then the peace of God that exceeds all understanding will keep your hearts and minds safe in Christ Jesus.

"From now on, brothers and sisters, if anything is excellent and if anything is admirable, focus your thoughts on these things: all that is true, all that is holy, all that is *just*, all that is *pure*, all that is *lovely*, and all that is worthy of praise. Practice these things. The God of peace will be with you."

That may seem like a tall order in this sometimes, very difficult world when emotions run high, the outside temperature runs low, and the darkness of winter seems to steal our resolve.

and crafts, animated video storytelling, and active games-all combined into a living-faith experience that will help children discover what it means to be a disci-


ple of Jesus Christ today! And for 5th-12 graders, submerge, also a Deep Blue curriculum.

girl and a worn out exhausted carpenter.



# Let's Go on Work Trips to MMDC in January & March 2017

We have reservations for two separate trips to Midwest Mission Distribution Center, Chatham, IL, coming up in early 2017. We will be leaving for each trip on Sunday early afternoon, arriving at the MMDC dorm in early evening, working Monday, Tuesday and a half day on Wednesday before returning home Wednesday evening. Dates of the trips are January 22 - 25 and March 5 - 8.

We never know exactly what we will be doing, but we are always busy the entire time with worthwhile work for the good of others. We might be assembling kits, building school desks, sewing school bags, counting items, or any other job needing to be done.

We will share breakfast and lunch and go out to eat in the evenings. Each participant will be responsible for the following costs to MMDC per trip: dorm fee of \$18 per night (\$54), volunteers materials fee (\$50), non-refundable processing fee (\$20) for a total of \$124. # Re-imagined Realm

To explore Jesus' teachings about the REVERSALS that mark life in God's realm. Matthew 5:1-12

Matthew, the **apostle**, is believed by many to be the author of the Gospel of Matthew. Scholars date his gospel around the early part of A.D. 50 to 90, when the church was largely Jewish and the gospel was preached to the Jewish Christians of Palestine.

The *Sermon on the Mount* was presented by Jesus to a small band of Jesus' followers who were feeling troubled by harassment from their broader society. Jesus' preaching of the beatitudes offered the promise of the ultimate *restoration of justice*, God's wholeness and peace. Jesus' teachings spoke of God's reign break-

ing into human society, turning typical human understanding and consequences upside down: Consider relatively recent history, when Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., suggested his children would be judged by the content of character, not the color of their skin. Nelson Mandela had

expressed a vision of a South Africa beyond apartheid.

We may view *worldly* blessings by admiring those with - - comfortable monetary security, good healthcare and retirement plans, being "good looking," enjoying surviving family members, pos-

sessing supportive friends and family.

A *blessing* is God's free **gift** to humankind. What kind of **living** brings God's blessings? Jesus answered: Those who are humble of heart, gentle, show mercy, who hunger and thirst for God's ways. Those who mourn, make peace, and are persecuted.

When **you** declare yourself as "blessed," you are proclaiming that God has blessed you. Blessings come **from God.** Gratitude comes **from our hearts.** Which shows humbleness: Proclaiming how "blessed you are," or proclaiming your gratitude? Why would you receive more "blessings" than anyone else?

It turns out this issue is a surprising but instrumental key to social change for women all over the world.





Days For Girls is an international, non-profit, ecumenical group whose purpose is to help girls gain access to quality sustainable feminine hygiene, vital health knowledge, and income-generation opportunities. To learn more about Days For Girls, visit the website at: www.daysforgirls.org.

# **Kiva Loans Update**

Several years ago the Sandwich Bunch contributed money to make loans of \$25 each throughout the world through an organization called KI-VA. As these loans were paid back, I have continued to make new loans.



The most recent loan of \$25 was made on December 17, 2016, to Global Trauma Project in Jubal, South Sudan. So far we have made loans in 33 countries including Armenia, Bolivia, El Salvador, Cambodia, and Haiti. During the years we have lent a total of \$2225 through 89 loans with about \$160 outstanding and a loss of only \$32. The majority of the loans are to women or groups of borrowers because these loans seem more likely to be successfully repaid. Most of the loans are to buy supplies for individuals and small businesses to make things to sell. At least one loan is from a repeat borrower who completed payment on their initial loan. Out of our initial investment of about \$200 we have been able to help many people in countries around the world achieve their goals. Jan Lewis

# **Iowa Justice for Our Neighbors**

The Lord reigns forever; he has established his throne for judgment. He will judge the world in righteousness; he will govern the peoples with justice.

The Lord is a refuge for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble. Psalm 9: 7-9.

The words of Psalms are often inspirational. This is a passage that inspires the work of Iowa Justice for Our Neighbors (JFON), a ministry of the Iowa Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

This Psalm reminds us that justice is a characteristic of the way God treats God's people. Righteousness is another characteristic of God's judgment. At Justice for Our Neighbors we take up these descriptions of the nature of God and apply them to help immigrants and refugees to keep their lives, and the lives of their families, safe and stable.

At its best, our government's immigration system can afford justice to immigrants and refugees, but it is much more attainable when there is a well-trained and experienced immigration attorney present as an advocate. Justice for Our Neighbors provides that advocacy, a work of righteousness as indicated in the Psalm.

The year of 2016 is coming to a close and JFON looks back at a new project that was very fruitful in terms of helping refugees. Looking again to the Psalm, we see that the word refugee comes from refuge. The Psalm gives us a definition: a stronghold in troubled times for oppressed people.

Indeed, the persons we see at JFON in our United Methodist Church-based legal clinics are oppressed people who have come to the U.S. looking for a stronghold in times of trouble. As a ministry of the United Methodist Church, the Iowa JFON network of six churches here in Iowa has been a part of this "stronghold."

A new project, "Refugee Green Card Clinics," were held at Grace UMC and DMACC in Des Moines on a monthly basis during 2016. The low-income refugees who attended were helped by volunteers trained and supervised by JFON immigration attorneys Ann Naffier, Brynne Howard and Emily Sohn Rebelsky. Beyond this monthly outreach, designed specifically for adjustment of status, all the six church-based legal clinics saw refugees for other refugee needs as well.

We choose justice and righteousness as our means of providing a refuge for the oppressed.

Thank you to the many churches and many individuals who help us to ensure that stronghold will be there for refugees coming to Iowa for 2017 by donating through the Iowa Advance at #0375.
