

Lenten Study

In much of our Christian life, we have known about the Ten Commandments. For some, the Ten Commandments are rules to live by. For some, they are absolutes with dire consequences. For others, they are outdated and obsolete. And yet, Jesus didn't call them obsolete. Jesus had a

high regard for them and even upped the ante on some.

What should we make of them? That's a question that takes more than a newsletter article to answer. In fact, it takes a deep dive with careful attention to their origin and their meaning through the ages.

I am inviting you to take that deep dive into the Ten Commandments during Lent. Through the six weeks of Lent, we will take this journey with Adam Hamilton, a leading pastor and teacher in the United Methodist Church through his book and study called Words of Life.

We will read the book on our own, 1 chapter each week. Then we will gather by Zoom to watch a video and talk about the chapter together.

If you are ready to invest in your spiritual growth; if you are willing to take this dive with others from the St. Luke family; and if you are hopeful for how your life may be enriched by these ancient rules for living together, then please join me.

We can be just like that tree. We become run down by the stresses of our lives. We begin to see ourselves as a bedraggled remnant of our former selves. We need to remember that though we




cannot wear a coat of hoarfrost, we can cover ourselves with God's grace. The truth is, to God we are beautiful in all of our states, but when we have faith in

Coming Through Captivity


MARK 1:29-39

Exploring healing and freedom from things that hold us captive: A Reciprocal Ministry

After Jesus was baptized in the Jordan and having spent forty days in the wilderness, He walked along the shore of the Sea of Galilee. Along this journey the following joined Him as His disciples: the brothers Simon and Andrew and also the brothers (sons of Zebedee) James and John. In their traveling Jesus went for rest with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. They told Him about Simon's mother-in-law who was there in bed, sick and feverish. Jesus went to her side, took her hand, and lifted her up. As soon as He touched her, the fever left and she felt well again—strong enough to bustle around the house taking care of her visitors. Word continued to spread of his deeds and crowds began to

press in around the dwelling seeking more words and deeds of power (healing) from Jesus.

The next morning Jesus rose very early, while it was still dark, and left by himself, seeking a deserted place to pray. Simon and the others eventually noticed him



missing and began looking for Jesus. They finally found him saying, "Everybody wants to know where You are!" In that brief time apart Jesus found renewed energy in God, the source of His strength.

Jesus moved on with the disciples to preach, heal, and cast out demons throughout Galilee.

Jesus restored the mother-in-law of Simon and was, himself, restored to continue preaching and healing. Common to both was a sense of ministering to and with others. God calls us to be active in God's mission; but God also calls us to rest and enter the stillness in which we can hear God's voice and be restored by God's peace.

[Did you know Simon's mother-in-law was the first person identified as serving or ministering to Jesus?]

Jane Kies – Missionary

Jane Kies is a United Methodist missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries teaching Intensive English. Here is a note from Jane, published on the Board of Global Ministries site.

"Having grown up in southern Africa, I have always felt drawn to this amazing part of the world. Someone

once said: "You are not born in Africa; Africa is born in you!" Though circumstances and studies took me to England for a while, I knew I would return. My first missionary experience was as a teacher in a small school in Uganda. Now, 36 years later, I am a Global Ministries missionary at Africa University in Zimbabwe. I teach English to students from other countries on the conti-



nent. Zimbabwe has had (and still has) its share of economic turbulence, uncertainty and strife in the 26 years my husband Larry and I have lived here, but the people and the country have given us a home that we love. I thrive on the lasting friendships, meaningful family life and active roles in the church. I love the relationships and influence of so many Zimbabwean and international students. I love watching students smile with pride as they become more fluent in English and move on to their degree program with greater confidence." November 2020.

100% of this offering is retained by the Iowa Annual Conference. The purpose of the Disability Awareness offering is to celebrate the gifts and graces of




persons with disabilities and to promote their full inclusion in the community. This offering provides funds for educational opportunities as well as providing grants to local
