St Luke had a team of 9 volunteers that worked at Midwest Mission Midwest Mission Distribution Center during the last week in February.



Pastor Chad Jennings, Karen Clark, Dave Miller and Corinne Kleppe from St. Luke were joined by Corinne's mom—Merilee Kleppe, Karen's neighbors—Mo & Jim Lockwood and Mike & Ginny Dalton from the Prairie City UMC. This wonderful group of volunteers worked on a variety of jobs including: as-

sembling 382 home care kits, sanding and finishing school desks, sewing machine repair, checking over personal dignity kits, packaging toilet paper and stuffing envelopes for mailing. They also brought with them 1,307 diapers, 6 sewing machines, lots of school supplies for school kits, 3 baby sweaters and 1 baby gown. All of these supplies are available for distribution throughout the world as needed. The center partners with a number of agencies for distribution in a network that is nothing short of miraculous.



Lent/Easter Offering

The NOW Committee has chosen 3 separate entities to be the recipients of the 2021 Lenten/Easter Offering. 2/3 of the offering will be designated to local programs, Discover Hope Ministries and Neighbor Helping Neigh-

Palm/Passion

MARK 11:1-11 AND MARK 14:1-15:47

Exploring the stories of Holy Week


<u>Passover</u> is one of the most widely observed holidays of the Jewish religion. It is held in observance of the Israelites being "passed over" by God's angel of death, brought on by the Egyptian pharaoh's refusal to release them. The Israelites marked their door frames with a lamb's blood so that the angel of death would recognize and "pass over" the Jewish residences. Those whose residences the angel of death did *not* pass over were to suffer the death of their firstborn.

On the evening after Passover the Jewish people were told by God to not allow their bread to rise, but to take everything, *as is*, and leave immediately. Past (baking) practice had been to leaven bread (use yeast) as part of the bread-making process, but the people were now instructed to bake the read "as is," and depart. Thus begat the <u>Feast of the Unleavened Bread</u>.

Two days before the Feast of Passover and, later, the Feast of the Unleavened Bread, Jesus was in Bethany eating dinner in the house

of Simon the leper. Bethany was less than 2 miles from Jerusalem. A woman came into the house carrying an alabaster flask filled with precious, sweetsmelling ointment made from spikenard. She came to Jesus, broke the jar, and gently poured out the perfume onto His head.

Spikenard, a highly-prized perfume, is a derivative of the honeysuckle plant. An online search states it may help with *anxiety, depression, insomnia,* and *stress*. Besides being used as an agent to cover the dead, can you see how it might benefit one who knows He is facing imminent death?



Many of Simon's dinner guests were critical of the woman's "wasting" this precious ointment, commenting how the value of it could bring funds used to help the poor, instead. Jesus rebuked them, saying, "Leave her alone. Why are you attacking her? She has done a good thing. The poor will always be with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you want. But I won't always be with you. She has done what she could for Me—she has come to anoint My body and prepare it for burial. Believe Me when I tell you that this act of hers will be told in her honor as long as there are people who tell the good news."

We are continuing with our worship assistant sign-up during the month of March. We want our




church family to feel as safe and comfortable as possible worshipping indoors so we are asking for volunteers at this time.



A Breath of Fresh Prayer

Norwegian theologian Ole Hallesby described prayer as simply letting God into our lives. God "knocks," he said, "not only in the solemn hours of secret prayer" but "in the midst of your daily work, your daily struggles, your daily grind ... when you need him most."

Prayer, added Hallesby, is as essential to life as air. "As impossible as it is for us to take a breath in the morning large enough to last us until noon, so impossible is it to pray in the morning in such a way as to last us until noon," he said. "Let your prayers ascend to [God] constantly, audibly or silently, as circumstances throughout the day permit."
