

Dear St Luke Family,

We have all sinned & fallen short of the glory of God, writes Paul in his Letter to Christians in Rome 3:9

We all have *flaws*. We all have **As Is** an *as is* tag attached to our toe or **3** finger. And even though we try hard to hide

them—those flaws are going to show up on occasion.

We all have a *sin-covered* mat on display similar to the story of the paralyzed man who was carried by four men to Jesus (Mark 2.)



We all sin, whether a small debt, or a large one, like Jesus' story to Simon as the womanof-the-night anointed Jesus' feet with her tears and oil, and dried them with her kisses and hair (Luke 7.)

It matters not who we may feel akin to in the Bible stories, we are all sinners with as is tags and sin-covered mats on display for all to see.

Like the woman-of-the-night, we can come to Jesus with all our flaws and sins hanging out all over the place, drop to our knees and without saying a word, Jesus knows what we are feeling as we lovingly and tenderly serve Him by loving, forgiving and serving one another.

And while the hand of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, Son of God, is on our heads He speaks those same words to us: *Your many sins are forgiven.* Luke 7



Do you feel it? Are you experiencing His forgiveness? Friends, Jesus himself says to us, Your many sins are forgiven. The one who is forgiven much, loves much.

Paul also informs us God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:3.) While we were still sinners, God loved us, accepted us, forgave and served us. We have been purchased with the blood of Jesus Christ. God, through Christ, paid the punishment, the price, for our sin by dying on the cross in our place, and exchanging our as is tags and sin-covered mats with a brand new label: Made in the Image of God—Priceless. When we have confessed and repented of our sin to our Savior, life will never be the same.


Our response to God's great unconditional love for us would be to live with one another with the same love, acceptance, forgiveness and servanthood as God has shown us. Think of how that would look at St Luke. Before, we even sin against one another we have already forgiven one another! Now that would be amazing!

When all sins are forgiven...no one has anything to hold against anyone else! And there will be love all around, acceptance, forgiveness and service galore! Jesus said with God, all things are possible (Mark 10.)

So, while we think of giving up something for Lent, let's take on this one great thing for God & for one another this Lenten season, live it through Easter & beyond.

In order to help us make that happen, I began the Lenten series, A World Worth Saving on March 19. It also suggests we give up something for Lent: Apathy.


News from our Librarian ~ Karen Clark

about it. People continue to exploit powerless men, women, and children in horrific ways throughout the world.



Hope Against All Hope Honoring Doubt and Belief As We Witness God's Steadfast Love in the Midst of Death John 11:1-45

When Jesus was traveling with his disciples He received word that one of His friends, Lazarus, brother of Mary and Martha, of Judea, was sick. "Lord, the one you love is sick." Jesus declared that the sickness would not end in death, "It is for God's glory that God's son may be glorified through it." After two more days Jesus began his journey to Judea, telling His disciples, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep; but I am going there to wake him up." His disciples thought he meant a natural sleep. Jesus clarified the situation by telling them Lazarus was dead. "And for your sake I am glad that I was not there, so that you may believe."

Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days by the time Jesus arrived in Bethany. Located less than two miles from Jerusalem, many (Jewish) friends were present to comfort the two sisters at the loss of their brother. Martha, hearing of Jesus' impending arrival, went to meet Him, outside their village: "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died..." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die."

Martha went back to her sister Mary, telling her Jesus was arriving and calling for her. Mary, along with their visiting friends, traveled to greet Jesus. Falling at His feet she proclaimed, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died." Jesus was deeply moved by the grieving and weeping of the mourners of Lazarus and wept, Himself.



Jesus came to the tomb and ordered the stone covering it be taken away. "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me." Because of witnessing Jesus' miracles, many more persons believed in Him.


snaps, ribbon, labels at a greatly reduced price, so money is also needed for those purchases.
