


"You Asked For It" Sermon Series

The Summer We Never Wanted

From Pastor

Life in 2020 is nothing like we ever imagined. That is an understatement. Graduations,

weddings, funerals, reunions, vacations, and sports are all cancelled or modified.

Many of us have been touched by this virus in some way or another. Some of you have been worried about whether you have come in contact with someone that has contracted Covid-19 and been tested yourself. While many have tested negative, some have tested positive.

The conversation lately has been around the opening of schools next month. Whether we *want* schools to reopen is not in question. Whether schools *should* reopen is another question. I, for one, am glad that I don't have to make the decision to reopen schools. Or how to do it safely. Or who should be there. There are so many factors to this.

Then again, the same considerations go into when and how to reopen St. Luke for in-person worship.

So far this summer, we have been worshipping together in the yard. This is has been a great success. I think this is partly because of the novelty and partly because we just craved community so much after so long. But mostly, I think its success can be attributed to the power of the Holy Spirit, which will not be stopped by anything.

That being said, the novelty of this will wear off. Either we will tire of outdoor worship, or the weather will turn cold and it will be impractical.

To get ahead of this, the Administrative Council met on Tuesday, July 14, to discuss reopening for indoor worship. In our conversation, we addressed several issues: the continued rise in the number of cases in Iowa and especially in Polk County, the ability of the virus to stay in the air for extended periods, the difficulty of keeping distance between people inside, the advise against singing



and responsive reading, and the risk that many of our community are in because of other health factors.

In light of these things, here is what the Council decided:


1. We will continue to worship outdoors. We will maintain the schedule of every other week at 9:30am. If it rains, we will postpone worship until the following weekend and post a conversation in its place. The schedule, as long as the weather permits

- is July 26, August 9, August 23, September 6, September 20.
- 2. We will broadcast these services on YouTube live, and perhaps Facebook live, each week. In the event that the broadcast doesn't work, we will record a back-up and post the service later in the day.
- 3. We will research online giving and electronic giving options for the convenience of our people.
- 4. We will prepare our infrastructure for in-person worship so that we can live stream the service in the fellowship hall as part of our reopening plan.
- 5. We will meet again in early September to reassess and plan for indoor worship.

We will keep you informed about what is happening at St. Luke through our bi-weekly newsletters. Thank you for your continued financial support. We appreciate you.

INGATHERING 2020


