
#### Online Sermon Series

I'm tired of this. I'm tired of not seeing you every week. I'm tired of wearing a mask everywhere I go. I'm tired of trying to figure out what we



can do for worship when it gets colder and what we can do for Sunday School. I'm tired of this.

And yet, I'm uplifted by your spirit. You have been faithful. You have continued to support St. Luke throughout this long, long night. You are a light in this darkness. Thank you for that.



And keep it up. The night is nowhere close to being over. The latest prediction

for when it will be safe to return to normal life, or what might pass for normal life, is in the fall of 2021 or the spring of 2022. Ugh.



Until then, here is the plan (subject to change, of course). The Ad Council met in July to discuss the return of in-person worship. At that time, we decided by consensus to remain in our

current schedule for outdoor worship of every other week until the end of September. In October, we intend to move worship indoors and return to an every week schedule. Because ambient air and surfaces need several hours to be virus free, we will only have one service each week. In order to allow for distancing, we will add livestreaming every week. I know that this hasn't been the most reliable service up to this point, but I'm working on solutions and hope to have things more stable in the next month. We will also ask for half of the worshipping body to worship in the Fellowship Hall. By doing this, we can still be together, and we can still be with our St. Luke family, but in more than one place. Those that are in the main Sanctuary one week will be asked to go to the Fellowship Hall the next week.

I know this isn't ideal, but it is what we can do to be safe for all our people. I thank you for your caring and your understanding of these measures. I don't want this, but I do want for all of us to be whole and healthy followers of Christ. We'll get through this. It will be better to get through this together.

### Disaster Ministries Latest Update

The August 10, 2020, derecho storm has devastated more than 150 communities in Iowa.

Beginning in Western Iowa, straight-line winds caused damage in many Iowa communities. The National Weather Service is calling it an "inland hurricane".

The storm, containing damaging lightning and thunder, heavy rain, and high winds, gained strength as it moved east across Iowa. Downed trees, power outages, power lines down, damage to buildings, and heavy rain have affected much of Iowa.

The United Methodist Chainsaw Teams have been out since day one and will continue. In addition, chainsaw crews from other conferences are responding.

Governor Kim Reynolds has issued <u>Disaster Declarations</u> for 25 counties. This makes available <u>Individual Assistance Grants</u> for those impacted. You have 45 days to apply. Application can be made through your local Community Action Agency. In addition, the Governor is seeking federal assistance.

#### HOW WE CAN HELP TODAY

- **PRAY and pray some more.** This storm has devastated Iowa, communities and crops. MANY, MANY are impacted. YOUR PRAYERS are NEEDED. It is in prayer that we unleash God's power for one another.
- VOLUNTEER. Help in needed in over 150 communities. Communities looking for help have listed times and locations for volunteer check in and contact numbers on their social media pages and city web pages. Check with the community in which you wish to volunteer for those details. The Volunteer Disaster Agencies in Iowa (Including the United Methodists) are all working together with the local city government to meet as many needs in as many communities as possible
- CONTACT. If you know someone who has been impacted by the storm; contact them! Call and offer words of encouragement and listen to them. Actual voice to voice contact makes a huge difference in time of loss and disaster. Ask them what they need, AND GET IT FOR THEM. If someone comes to mind, there is a reason for it, be God's hands and heart and reach out.
- **DONATE FINANCIALLY.** Donations can be given thru the United Methodist <u>Church Advance Special</u> #223. ALL donations are used for supporting and helping Iowans affected by these storms.
- **DONATE PHYSICAL ITEMS.** So many have lost so much, we can help today with donations of:
  - Battery operated fans
  - Flashlights (and extra batteries)
  - Lanterns
  - Personal Hygiene items (MUST be new and in original packages)
    - \* Soap, shampoo, lotion, toothbrushes, deodorant, hand towels

- Large, heavy trash bags
- Containers totes with lids to pack personal items in
- Charcoal grills
- Solar powered portable chargers for phones
- Tarps and tie downs
- Gloves heavy work gloves and rubber gloves
- Propane
- Wet wipes
- Charcoal
- Individually wrapped snacks


