will be with you." from Isaiah 43:2 was the focus verse for the week.






Lord, you have examined me. You know me...Even from far away, you comprehend my plans...You surround mefront and back. You put your e Psalm 139:1 2b 5



hand on me. Psalm 139:1, 2b, 5.

Where is God? I think that we understand on an intellectual level that God is everywhere. God is as big as the universe, and yet, still resides in us. This is a concept that I found in several places in scripture, but my favorite is from Psalm 139. This psalm tells us that God is so familiar with us that we have nothing to hide, nothing to fear. I find comfort in knowing that God is always with me, never far from me. In fact, one of my favorite descriptions of God comes from Paul Tillich, who says that God is the *ground of our being*. God is the essence of everything that exists. Nothing exists without God. Everything exists with God as its basic materials. We live in an ocean of God.

And yet, when we talk about God, it is often as if God exists elsewhere. We ask, *where are you God?* We talk about God living in



Heaven, which is someplace *out there*. We ask God to come down to earth. And I get it, because as we begin worship every week, I invite God to come into the worship space and to be a part of our gathering.

Every week I do this, I feel a little off. With this prayer, I am trying to center us, trying to focus us on the presence of God among us. But, I truly believe that God is everywhere and in everything, so asking God to come to where God already is feels weird. It feels like I am telling us all that God exists elsewhere.

The problem with thinking about God as elsewhere is that we miss out on the intimacy that God wants with us. God wants to share in every part of our lives. God wants us to worship constantly. I heard a pastor this week explain that worship is the aligning of our heart, mind, and will with God. When everything that we do is in alignment with God's will for the world, we are worshiping, even as we work or play. This is much easier if we think of God as being right there with us all the time.

I've also heard people say that if we feel far away from God, it is not God that moved, but us. On a metaphorical level, I resonate with this. But in a practical way, even this is impossible. Psalm 139 tells us that there is nowhere we can go to be away from God's presence. So, even if we try to move away from God, we can't. We live in an ocean of God.

So, in those moments when we feel distant, it is more a matter of disconnection. In those moments, it is our heart, our will, and our thinking that is no longer in alignment with God's. In those moments, we need to adjust our being to notice the presence of God that is always right there with us.

Of course, I will still open worship by inviting God into our presence. I will still feel weird using that language. But the reality is that when talking about God, I am often without words that adequately express what God is. About the best I can do is to try and to yearn for a more complete description for a God that is indescribable.

May God be with you always. God always is. Pastor Chad



What Spills Out?


Rev. Henry Wingblade once compared the Christian personality to the unseen soup in a

bowl carried high over a waiter's head. No one knows what's inside unless the waiter is bumped or trips. If Jesus is truly living inside us, Wingblade said, what spills out should be the fruit of the Spirit: love,



joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

When you falter, what do people see? How can your "spillage" better reflect the Holy Spirit, who lives in you?



Building Up the Body Recognizing and Affirming Gifts Within the Church Community: Ephesians 4:1-16

This passage in Ephesians 4 has three areas of emphasis: 1-the image of the church as one body; 2-the grace and gifts that *each* person is given (the gifts have a purpose); and 3-the expectation of us to mature in our faith and the description of the church in its Christ-likeness.

The author describes the "new world" as God calls us to live with humility, patience, and love, walking as Jesus walked. We are encouraged to do that which is necessary to hold onto the unity which binds people together in peace. The unity has already been created; believers are directed to *guard* that unity.

God handed down to us the ability for **everyone** to be *leaders of different sorts* -- some apostles; others may be prophets, evangelists, pastors, or teachers. All are gifts for our community in order to *build up the body of Christ*. Consider which gifts you may possess and **freely share**!

Ingathering 2018 School kits

Ingathering 2018 has made some changes from prior years. There are now only two types of kits being collected and the school kit no longer requires school bags, just supplies. This year we will be collecting School kit supplies during the months of July and August... and yes, crazy as it seems the school supplies start showing up in stores in July. There is a basket on the Mission Table to collect supplies.

The School Kits provide tools for education, which changes lives. Kits include:

• 3 One-Subject Notebooks, approx. 8¹/₂x11" (total of 210-250 sheets of paper)

- 1 eraser, 2-inch or longer
- 1 blunt-end scissors (metal blades)
- 1-30 cm metric ruler



- 1 pencil sharpener (1" minimum)
 1 box of 24 crayons (ONLY 24)
- 6 unsharpened pencils with erasers

We will also need two gallon plastic bags (ie: ziplock, glad, etc).
