When you send that text, you will get an automated response to tell us your name. We don't have everyone's mobile number, and having a name associated with your number will help us to tailor texts to the groups who need them, rather than sending everyone a message about the trustees meeting.

We intend to use this service sparingly. We might remind you of outdoor worship, but mostly this is for sending important messages from the church. Thank you for participating.

2020 has been an exhausting year! With the pandemic keeping us distanced from one another and now a storm like none I have ever experienced. I don't know about you... but I am tired! And when

you are used to a fan or AC when you sleep... the lack of power and the stress filled days make sleep a bit challenging.

The derecho storm on August 10th traveled over 770 miles from South Dakota/Nebraska to Ohio, at times producing category 3 or 4 hurricane winds ranging in speed from 74 to 140 miles per hour. The damage is so widespread and extensive it is daunting to look at. For the tree lover in me, this is so sad.

There has been a lot of good too, however. My family and friends are uninjured and healthy. The company I work for is up and running and doing what we can to help our clients (including St Luke). River Sunday

REVELATION 22: 1-5

Inspiration from John's vision of God's river of life, renewing all creation.

There is no consensus as to who wrote the book of Revelation. Some say the author is the *Apostle* John; others believe the author to be an "unknown Christian prophet John." Revelation is believed to have been written during the reign of the Roman emperor Domitian, 81-96. The author of Revelation describes a dream, or vision, in 22 chapters.

In his life John had never entered a city which had no temple. Some cities had multiple temples. During his life Jerusalem, of course, had *thee* temple. John's dream, as shared in Revelation, describes a city without a temple. The city needed no temple because it was the *new Jerusalem*. No temple was needed because *God and the Lamb live with them, constantly in view. Their throne sits prominently in the city. Their light forever illumines its streets and citizens.*

In his dream John's heavenly guide brought him to a **river of** *pure living waters*, *shimmering as brilliantly as crystal*. On each bank of the river stood the *tree of life, firmly planted*, bearing twelve kinds of fruit and producing its sweet crop every month throughout the year.

The tree of life, you may recall, is first mentioned Genesis in 3:24. After driving them (Adam and Eve) Не stationed out. winged guardians at the east end of the garden of Eden and set up a sword of flames which



alertly turned back and forth to guard the way to the tree of life. Taking fruit from the tree of life would have allowed Adam and Eve to live forever. In the book of Revelation no one is denied access to its fruit and healing leaves.

In Revelation 22:1-5 the world is brought together at the banks of the river of pure living waters, the tree of life, and the brightly shining throne of God and the Lamb. Neither a lamp, nor the sun will ever be required because the Lord God will be their illumination.
