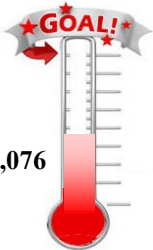

Where: Agnes Patterson Park Shelter House. In case of rain, we will meet in Fellowship Hall at the church.

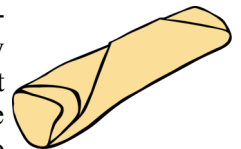
What to bring: A potluck dish to share, your table service and lawn chairs. Drinks will be provided.

This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> in the series about our Discipleship Pathway.



I recently got an email from the Booster Club. It began by thanking me for being a booster last year and asked if I wanted to be a booster again this year. I expected this. But then, it said something that surprised me. It said, *your contribution in no way obligates you to serve on the board or volunteer for any activities.*

Even though it surprised me, I think it is becoming very common in life. We are busy people. Our time is valuable. The thought of committing to something else seems like a difficult endeavor. And yet, when someone asks me if I would be willing to serve on a board or in a ministry, my first thought is, *how can I work my schedule so I can say yes?*

I think I do this because I believe it is important to **Serve**. Whenever something is important to the community or to the church and I believe in the cause, it is important to put some time into it. Giving money is important, but when time is such a scarce commodity, our willingness to **Serve** shows our commitment to it.



This is very true for the church. When Jesus called people to become disciples, he didn't tell them that they had to give everything they had to the common purse that the disciples carried. Jesus didn't have a membership fee. Instead, he called for people to leave everything that took their time and to give it to Jesus in the form of following. The time they gave was the proof of their commitment to the community of God.

In the same way, our time is valuable to the church. When we are willing to **Serve** in a ministry, two things happen. The first is that the ministry has the energy and workforce to thrive. The second is that we become invested in its success. This is the way that the community of God grows.

Twice in recent conversations, I learned about folks that were asked to move to a new community to be a part of a team starting a church. They weren't offering anything for this move. In fact, they are pretty clear that they are supposed to find a job in the new community, contribute a good deal of their income to the new ministry, and to give their time to recruit new people to show up at the ministries that they will also be the staff for. This is a huge commitment. It really is giving up life as they know it in order to start something new. One thing is for sure, when people do that, they are pretty invested in its success.

I'm not asking you to move, or to give up your life as you know it. But I am asking for your time. When we **Serve**, we are investing in what God is doing at St. Luke. When we give our time and energy to the ministries that

God is calling us to, we become invested in its outcome.

**Service** is a vital part of the life of faith. As this new season begins, open yourself to serving the church. Maybe it is something that is right in your wheelhouse. Perhaps it will be in something you've never thought of before. It might be something that you think you have nothing to offer. Put those thoughts aside and open yourself to be blessed by serving God in whatever way you are led.

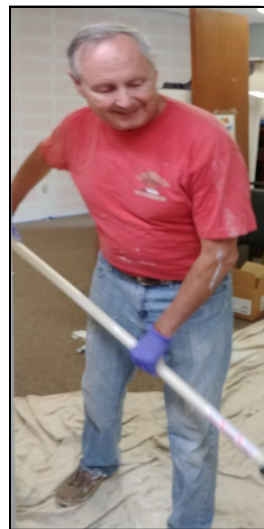


**Serving** is a vital part of the life of a disciple. You are vital to the success of this community of faith. Thank you for being willing to **Serve**.

Psalms 107:28-32

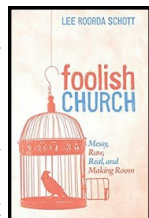
Let God bring a stillness to your world. Ask him to calm you in the storm. Turn your face to the Son and be thankful.

## Keeping Focus LUKE 16:19-31

### What constitutes the “true riches” of life?

Lazarus was a poor man, covered with sores. He was “dumped” on the doorstep of a rich man. All Lazarus lived for was to get a meal from the scraps of the rich man; his best friends were *dogs who came and licked his sores.*

When Lazarus died he was taken by angels to Abraham’s lap. The rich man died, was buried, and in hell. He looked up and saw Abraham with Lazarus in his lap. *“Father Abraham, mercy! Have mercy! Send Lazarus to dip his finger in water to cool my tongue. I’m in agony in this fire.”*

Abraham replied that now the rich man will be tormented, and Lazarus will be consoled... *“In your lifetime you got the good things and Lazarus the bad things.”*

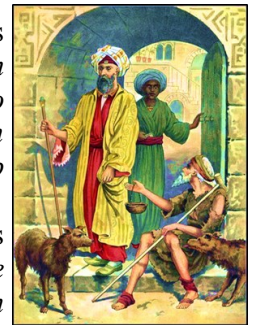
The rich man did not give up. He was thinking of his still-living five brothers. *“Then let me ask you, Father: Send him (Lazarus) to the house of my father... so he can tell them the score and warn them, so they won’t end up here in this place of torment.”*

Abraham reminded the rich man that his five brothers had always had *“Moses and the prophets to tell them the score. Let them listen to them.”*

The rich man still did not give up. *“I know, Father Abraham. But they are not listening. If someone would **come back to them from the dead**, they would change their ways.”*

(Can’t you just imagine Abraham almost slapping his forehead in disbelief?) *“If they won’t listen to Moses and the Prophets, they are **not** going to be convinced by someone who rises from the dead.”*

## Diaper Sewing Days

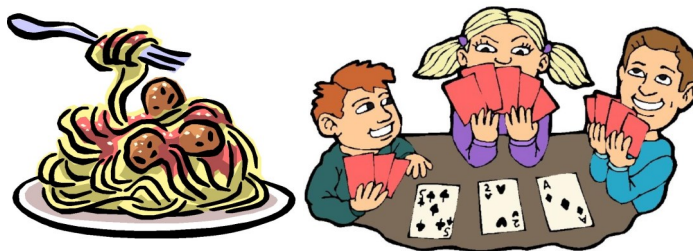
We have lots of diapers cut out and yards of flannel. Come and join us as we make diapers for MMDC.
