My Story

We walked into the corn maze, convinced we could find our way. We walked and walked and soon it seemed we might be walking in circles. The maze that year was a picture of the Quaker Oats

Mascot. And we, it seemed, were stuck somewhere in his hair, walking past the same corn, over and over again. Eventually we had to admit

we needed help finding our way out of the maze. The farm had incorporated hints in different locations, which would direct your footsteps toward the exits built into the



corn maze. We used those hints to make our way through the corn, and back to the open space outside of the maze cornfield.

There are times when we need to do the same thing in our faith walk... we eventually must admit that we need help. We have to look for the signs that point us in the right direction and guide us toward a stronger faith.

Psalm 121:1-2 I will lift up my eyes to the hills, from where does my help come? My help



comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth

Psalm 31:3 For You are my rock and my fortress; for Your name's sake lead me and guide me.

John 16:13-14 But when the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all truth. For He will not speak on His own authority. But

He will speak whatever He hears, and He will tell you things that are to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify Me, for He will receive from Me and will declare it to you.

It is important to ask for help when you are lost... in a corn maze... while driving your car... and in your life and faith. The Bible tells us that if we ask; the Holy Spirit will guide us.

A Liberation Community

Exodus 13:1-14


What really matters as individuals and as a community of God's people.

Moses had led the Hebrew people out of Egypt after they had lived there for hundreds of years. In this passage from Exodus, Moses had been absent from the travelers' encampment for 40 days. The people were losing their faith, *impatient*, and growing restless, eventually calling for a *physical representation* of God. They began making other gods and committing selfish acts. With Aaron's complicity an idol in the shape of a calf was made from collected earrings, and an alter built in front of it.

While Moses was still on the mountain God directed him to go back down; God shared with Moses His plan to destroy those heretics. Moses pleaded with God, reminding Him of His promise made to Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, that He would make their descendants and give them a "promised land."

We, too, could be reminded of our longing for more patience

during two recent calamities: COVID-19 and the derecho. During the pandemic there are some who question science - - the virus's authenticity; or question the value of wearing facial masks to help control the spread of airborne particles. Some people think the value of a human life is less important, than the importance of "getting back to a 'normal'." Patience is in such a short supply with some people, leading to a lack of empathy and devaluing the corporeal.



When the August derecho struck, some were without electricity for 7+ days; some (only) 1-2 days. How difficult it was to keep hoping *when* we would again have electricity access! It is difficult to be **patient** over something of which we have *little control*! God reminds us that He is always with us.


