- October 2: \$5802 including \$160 -Apportionments; \$346 - Building fund; \$13.75 - Sunday School; \$61 -Heifer Project; \$90 - World Communion Sunday.
- October 9: \$2313 including \$123 -Apportionments; \$100 - Building fund; \$14.50 - District Askings; \$950 - Rental Income.
- October 16: \$1366 including \$350-Apportionments; \$180 - Building fund; \$102 -Wills & Memorials; \$16 - District Askings.
- October 23: \$1653 including \$300 -Apportionments; \$324 - Building Fund; \$14.62 - District Askings.

The 2nd-5th Sunday Offerings at Sunday School will go toward District Askings through December 2016. Our goal is \$757; we have \$392 remaining.





"The Lord is my portion," says my soul, "therefore I will hope in Him." Lamentations 3:23-25



# God's Path to Peace

ISAIAH 2:1-5 To explore what it means to live in God's ways of peace.

Many scholars believe the content of the book of Isaiah was written at different times. Chapters 1-33 are thought to contain the words of the *original* Isaiah. Isaiah was appointed by God to warn the people in Judah that they were evil and should ask God to forgive them. Chapters 1-33 are viewed as warnings of judgment and promises of subsequent restoration for Jerusalem, Judah, and the nations. Isaiah chapters 34-66 presume the (earlier-referenced) judgment has been pronounced and "restoration" will soon be following.

In chapter 2 Isaiah describes a vision of Jerusalem in which God is sitting on the highest mountain in the center of the world with all nations streaming to the holy city seeking God's instruction and guidance. God is described as "dispensing justice," and settling disputes. Meanwhile, the people "will hammer their swords into sickles, reshape their spears into pruning hooks. One nation will not attack another. They will not practice war any more.'

In God's new world not only must the weapons be destroyed; they will be repurposed. Crucial to Isaiah's prophecy is the active nature of peacemaking. Martin Luther King, Jr. once stated, "Peace is not the absence of conflict, but the presence of justice." In order for justice to (even) exist, there must be action: those seeking and working for peace. Who are some individuals working for peace, today, that could possibly be identified as prophets? What do they warn us against? What are the challenges of following any prophet?

The Seasons of the Spirit Bible Study Class meets Sunday mornings at 9:15 to read about and discuss issues related to each week's prescribed lectionary readings. Come, join in the learning!

## **RECYCLING CHRISTMAS LIGHTS**


It is getting close to that time of year when you may be bringing out your Christmas lights. If you are like many, you may need to jettison those strands which no longer function.




Do not throw them away. Take the non -working lights to St. Luke to be RECY-CLED. Place your non-working light strings in the marked box located beneath the entry coat rack.


