Financial Update

Thank you for your continued support to St Luke. As of October 20, we are about 3 months behind on our apportionments. The past few

The past few years St Luke has

struggled at the end of the year to meet our financial responsibilities but has somehow always been able to fulfill our obligations. Prayerfully consider your giving so that St Luke can meet the remaining \$8500 in apportionments for 2017.

These offerings have been received for the month of October:

October 1: \$5017 including \$515-Building Fund; \$16-Sunday School supplies; \$125-UMCOR; \$112-World Communion Offering; \$367-CROP.

October 8: \$2693 including \$170-Building Fund; \$100-Apportionments; \$17-Salvation Army; \$150-UMCOR.

October 15: \$1636 including \$149-Building Fund; \$19-Salvation Army; \$100-UMCOR.

October 22: \$2972 including \$20-Apportionments; \$15-Salvation Army; \$1670 (includes the \$285 from Chili Cook-Off) -Building Fund.

The balance on the building loan is \$7,230 thanks to your generosity.






All Saints Sunday November 5

My Story

My neighbor's dog met me after work, bouncing and barking at the end of his leash. When I stopped and said his name, Gizmo's posture changed, he dropped his head to his

front paws and stuck his wagging tail in the air. I did a little hop to the side and off he went in response. He raced back and forth, pausing now and then to get me to re-engage. This has become our frequent peek-a-boo tag, and it makes me smile. There is power in a name, once I called Gizmo by name, he becomes joyful and ready to play.

Think about it, when someone calls you by name... and pronounces it correctly... we feel important, acceptoften and



loved. There are over 1000 references to the word "name" in the Bible. They remind us of many things. We are encouraged to Fear his name (Psalm 102); Bless his name (Psalm 96); Praise the name of the Lord (Psalm 145 and 148); to Call upon the name of the Lord (Isaiah 65:1/ Romans 10:13) and even to Ask for things in My (Jesus') Name (John 16:26). The scriptures also remind us that he knows our name too... and at times... gives someone a new and significant name (Genesis 17:5 and 35:10/ Matthew 16:18). Yes, there is power in a name, and God knows yours.

What Should I Do?

Embracing Jesus' ethic for leadership in our personal and church practice of ministry: Matthew 23:1-12

Jesus addressed the leadership practices of the institutional religious leaders who were, in Matthew's time, the scribes and Pharisees. The scribes were trained in the Law of Moses, worked closely with the priests, and were responsible for **interpreting** the law. The Pharisees were a Jewish "denomination" which emphasized learning scripture and following religious practices and the Law of Moses. They strove to uphold the Law (such as food and rituals of purity) in their daily lives.

The Pharisees were used by Jesus, in this passage, as an example of the unrighteous, but pious. He encouraged the crowds and His disciples to follow the Pharisees' words, but not their examples, as the Pharisees were a "faithless" group. "They are interested, above all, in presentation: they wrap their heads and arms in the accoutrements of prayer, they cloak themselves with flowing tasseled prayer garments, they covet the seats of honor at fine banquets and in the synagogue, and they love it when people recognize them in the marketplace, call them 'Teacher,' and beam at them."

A question to ask yourself: When can **humility** become a **hin**drance in spreading the gospel? Consider the examples of Martin Luther King Jr. or Dietrich Bon- "The greatest among you will be hoeffer. How should we live?


