# **My Story**



For to us a child is born, to us a son is given... Isaiah 9:6a

Are you like me? Do you hear the music when you hear this scripture? I always hear Handle's Messiah in my head when this scripture is read. Okay, let's be hon-

est, I end up singing this scripture, almost every time. I can't seem to help myself. Christmas music, for me, is a huge part of the season. I



like to listen to it (but not until December). I like to sing it in worship, in my car, at my desk at work. It always seems to bring back happy memories of Christmas' past.

A few times in my adult life, I have found myself with little to no voice during the holiday season. As frustrating as it is for me when my voice is silenced, keeping me from celebrating the birth of Jesus the way I would wish to celebrate, at times it can be a gift also. A couple of years ago, I developed laryngitis around Thanksgiving and really didn't get my full voice back until January. That Christmas season, I found myself listening to the voices around me. I enjoyed the season in a new way as I experienced the joy of the sounds of Christmas, without adding my own voice into the mix.

Don't get me wrong, I still wanted to sing, but I learned that I can still experience that joy, through the voices of others. As we move into the Advent and Christmas season, I pray we all rejoice in the sounds of Christmas... the scriptures, the music, the voices... like we never have before.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6





#### Messengers of Change

**LUKE 1:68-79** 

To live towards God's reign in hope and expectation.

Zacharias was born into a family of *priests*. He served in the temple of Jerusalem, as had his father before him. His wife, Elizabeth, too, came from a priestly family. Both were quite old and childless. One day Zacharias was chosen to perform his "priestly duties" in God's presence, in the sacred precincts of the temple.

Suddenly Zacharias realized he was not alone; Gabriel, a messenger from God appeared and informed him that his wife Elizabeth was going to have a son. The parents should name their son John; he would be a prophet; and he would turn many of the children of Israel around to follow the path to the Lord their God. John's birth would fulfill a prophecy and prepare the people and make them ready for God.

Responding with incredulity, Zacharias questioned Gabriel: How can I be sure of what you're telling me? ... This is hard to believe! The messenger Gabriel told him, "Because you didn't believe my message, you will not be able to talk – not another word – until you experience the fulfillment of my words."

Much occurred in the time between Gabriel's visit and John's birth: It took a while for Zacharias's acquaintances to

figure out why he was unable to talk; Gabriel appeared to the unmarried Mary, explaining that *she* would bear a son, Jesus, who would become known as the Son of the Highest God. Mary would visit her cousin Elizabeth. Zacharias and



Elizabeth broke custom and named their newborn son <u>John</u>, as the messenger Gabriel had initially directed. (Custom at that time dictated children be named after *someone in their family*.)

When Zacharias's voice was restored he sang from the fullness of the Spirit a prophetic blessing, Luke 1: 68-79, praising God for His intervention and the birth of his and Elizabeth's son and John's destiny to be a prophet.

The Seasons of the Spirit Bible Study Class meets Sunday mornings, after the 9:30 church service. To honor all present we are immunized and wear face masks. The class's emphasis is on the weekly lectionary readings.
