Financial Update

The Finance Committee would like to thank the congregation for its great response to the Estimate of Giving cards that have been turned in thus far. The totals are ahead of

last year for both the general fund and the building fund. Hopefully we will soon be able to have the building fund paid off! There is still time to turn in your Estimate of Giving cards if you have not had time to do so yet.

Also, as the end of the year draws near, we are reminded that the remainder of our 2017 apportionment (\$8,000) need to be paid. We are getting closer, but we need to go over the top. Thank you for your prayerful, generous giving.

These offerings have been received for the month of November:

October 29: \$2901 including \$100-Building Fund; \$10-Salvation Army; \$48 -Heifer International; \$1301-Ingathering.

November 5: \$4902 including \$280-Building Fund; \$9-Sunday School supplies; \$50-Salvation Army; \$941-Wills & Memorials.

Advent is upon us. Advent means waiting. In this day of instant everything, we have a hard time waiting. We want everything now. This only



seems to get worse as time goes on.

When I was a kid, I didn't like to wait either. Every year, as soon as Thanksgiving was over, I would make a paper chain that marked the days until Christmas. I couldn't wait until morning when I would rip another link and anticipate Christmas again. As that chain became shorter, I knew that Christmas was even closer, and



my excitement grew. And the shorter the chain, the harder it was to wait. I often wondered if Christmas would come more quickly if I ripped an extra link or two.

I wonder what it would have been like for the ancient Jews to wait for the messiah. Of course, they didn't have the instant communication that makes us impatient. However, they had been waiting for centuries for the messiah to come. How could they wait that long? Did their anticipation become so stale that they had given up?

God sent prophets to tell the Israelites that the messiah was coming. These messengers reminded the people that God was still here, and that God still cared for them. God still planned to send the savior, and he would be called Immanuel, or God with us. And then, God sent Jesus to show us what love is.

We celebrate Advent to remind us that God with us came to live among us. We celebrate to remind us that the promise of God coming again is still valid, even though it has been centuries since the promise was made. God with us is coming someday, and comes every day. Christmas is coming. The chain has been made.

Until then, Advent is here. Let's anticipate Christmas together and share in the excitement that this season brings by sharing *God with us* with the world.






Rejoicing and being active Participants in God's ongoing promise to reshape and restore our lives: Luke 2:22-40

According to the law of Moses, Jesus' mother, Mary, was required to observe ceremonial days of postpartum purification. Mothers of sons were considered unclean for seven days and on the eighth day the child was circumcised. Following this observation Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to Jerusalem's temple to present Him to the Lord. [Women then continued in their purification for thirty-three more days (totaling 40).] In the temple, Joseph and Mary offered the required sacrifice of two turtledoves or two young pigeons.

At the same time in the temple was a man named **Simeon**. The Holy Spirit had revealed to Simeon that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Anointed One. Simeon had been led to the temple that day by the Spirit, and there he saw the child Jesus with His parents, fulfilling their sacred obligations. Simeon took Jesus into his arms and blessed God: Now, Lord and King, You can let me, Your humble servant, die in peace.

Jesus' father and mother, of course, were shocked to hear Simeon say these things. Simeon went on to bless them both, too, and he made predictions concerning both Jesus and Mary.
