my head – I couldn't even see half a block ahead of my car. I wasn't going anywhere by car... except back home.

The snow was falling steadily but the wind was minimal, and since I couldn't drive to Newton, I decided to worship

God a different way. I bundled up in warm clothes and snow boots and took a walk in the snow. The town was blanketed in quiet beauty as the snow fell around me. There were no cars on the streets, no dogs barking, no people out and about, the sounds in the air felt buffered and calming. I felt like I was in my very own



snow globe. It was a perfect winter walk for praising God and celebrating the beauty only God can create.

Our world can be a very noisy place. Sometimes we need to step into a "snow globe" world of quiet so that we can focus on God.

I'm asking God for one thing, only one thing: To live with him in his house my whole life long. I'll contemplate his beauty; I'll study at his feet. That's the only quiet, secure place in a noisy world, The perfect getaway, far from the buzz of traffic. Psalm 27: 4-5.

As often as possible Jesus withdrew to out-of-the-way places for prayer. Luke 5:16

Both the Psalmist and Jesus knew that there are times when we must find a quiet place to be with God. To stop listening to the noisy world around us and focus on God. Step into your "snow globe" and look for the peace that only God can give.

For starters, that involves daily quiet time, devotion and prayer. "Sometimes I wake with the thought of a person on my mind," writes Tichy. "I'm quiet with this impression, interceding for the family member or friend until it has lifted. Could this be a whisper from our Savior?"




