United Methodists in the News

In the last few weeks, there have been many articles popping up in the news. The articles are usually headlined with something like *Church Splits Over Homosexuality*. Then you might read



an article about the waves of churches that are leaving the denomination over the issue of full inclusion in the full life of the United Methodist Church. While some of the churches that are leaving will tell you that everyone is welcome there, they are only welcome to a point. The argument has been primarily over whether LGBTQia+ folks can be married in the church, whether our pastors can officiate at those weddings, and whether those folks can become pastors in the church.

While this has been happening for decades, and especially over the last couple of years, there was a deadline set for churches and pastors to leave the denomination under the current set of rules. That deadline is December 31, 2023. Since this is Annual Conference season, and it takes a vote of the Annual Conference for churches to leave, now is the time when the wave of churches are going. On May 23, Iowa held a special session of Annual Conference for the specific purposes of having this vote. On that evening, 83 churches were approved to leave on June 30, 2023.

That seems like a lot of churches, right? It is, and it isn't. Iowa has 750 United Methodist congregations. So, 83 is about 11 percent. That is a much smaller number than many anticipated. In some conferences in the United States, that percentage was much higher. And even though some conferences are giving another opportunity before year's end to leave, including Iowa in November, we anticipate much smaller numbers in that later exit date.

So, what does that mean for us? Well, it means that we can all pursue the mission of the Church, which is to make disciples of Christ for the transformation of the world, in the ways that we deem faithful. That is true for those staying and those leaving.

It means that we can stop fighting about this and spend our energy on ministry together.

It means that we can be able to say to people, "you will be welcome at a United Methodist church if you are LGBTQia+" without a disclaimer.

There is still work to do. Our rules of governance, which we call *The Discipline* still contains words that exclude. Those words will need to be removed, which can only be done by General Conference action. General Conference is the worldwide gathering that takes place every four years. The next one is being held in April 2024.

The bottom line for us, though, is that we are now ready to move forward. At this year's Iowa Annual Conference, there was a spirit of hope that I haven't felt in quite the same way. I believe a new day has dawned and we can be the church that God is calling us to be. We are not splitting. We are becoming whole again.


