

She studied general education at Barão de Aiuruoca State College in Barra Mansa and received a bachelor's degree in international relations from Uninter in Volta Redonda, Rio de Janeiro, in January 2020. 

To open ourselves to unexpected opportunities for healing witness


The king of Aram had a valuable army commander, Naaman. Aram is located in present-day Syria. Commander Naaman had won many important battles for his king, therefore he was greatly esteemed by the king. Naaman did have one "negative" with which he had to deal: the skin disease *leprosy*. During one of the battles, a little girl was kidnapped and taken from Israel to be a servant to Naaman's wife.

At one point the young girl did become aware of her mistress's husband's condition and shared: If only my master could be near the prophet in Samaria; the prophet there could heal my master's disease. From this, Naaman approached his king, sharing what the young girl had related. The king decided: I am going to write a letter to Israel's king, and I want you to take it to him immediately.

Naaman headed to Israel with the letter from his king. The Israeli king was given Naaman's message letter which said: *The man carrying this letter is my servant...I request that you heal him.* The Israeli king took less-than-kindly to receipt of the letter, expressing thoughts that questioned the motives of Naaman's king. He knew he had no

personal means of healing Naaman, a great soldier of the country which had defeated Israel.

Elisha, an Israeli prophet, heard of the king's dilemma. He sent a message to the king, recommending the king send Naaman to (the prophet) Eli-

structions which he (eventually) did, and then was healed.






