Last month we learned about Bruna Farat. This month I am sharing information about Temba Nkomozepi. Temba is a missionary with the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries serving as an agriculturalist in Mujila Falls Agriculture Center in Kanyama, Zambia.

Temba takes part in a range of agricultural, education and health projects, as well as church growth and development. Mujila Falls raises essential crops, such as corn, and engages in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, fruit culture, tree nurseries, fish culture and research.

Temba is from Zimbabwe where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in agriculture from the

United Methodist-related Africa University in Mutare. He holds both Master of Science and the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degrees in agricultural civil engineering, with an emphasis on water resource management, from Kyungpook National University in Daegu, South Korea. He has worked for the Green Impact Trust, Caritas Harare, and for the Zimbabwean department of agricultural extension.

Taking a group of youth on a mission trip was a lot of work. However, it was also an opportunity to see the fruits of the spirit being developed in teenagers. Persevering Faith

Hebrews 11:29-12:2 Celebrating and considering our place among the cloud of faithful witnesses

This letter to the Hebrews, author unknown, was written six or seven decades after Jesus was crucified and resurrected. With example after example the writer reminds the Hebrews of those gone before who had experienced testing of their faith. The author spares few Biblical illustrations in reminding the Hebrews of persons who had suffered **great** testing - - physical, emotional, testing of patience, torment, betrayal - - and yet persevered because of their strong faith.

To read of the examples in these passages, of persons persevering, in spite of unimaginable testing of their character's strength and faith is inspiring.

Examples of **faith** from Hebrews 11 & 12: By faith the walls of Jericho toppled after the people had circled them for seven days | By faith the prostitute Rahab welcomed the Hebrew spies into her home so that she did not perish with the unbelievers. | I could speak of faith bringing women

their loved ones back from death and how the faithful accepted torture instead of earthly deliverance because they believed they would obtain a better life

By faith he kept the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood, so that he who destroyed the firstborn would not touch them. By faith they passed through the Red Sea as though they were passing through dry land; and the Egyptians, when they attempted it, were drowned. - Hebrews 11:28-29

in the resurrection. Others suffered mockery and whippings; they were placed in chains and in prisons. The faithful were stoned, sawn in two, killed by the sword, clothed only in sheepskins and goatskins; they were penniless, afflicted, and tormented. The world was not worthy of these saints. They wandered across deserts, crossed mountains, and lived in the caves, cracks, and crevasses of the earth.




