New Online Church Directory

We are excited to announce we are updating our St Luke church directory and this time it will be available online. You will now have access to our directory on your computer or your mobile device. A printed copy of the directory will also be available per request once it is completed.

The first step in creating our directory is getting updated information from all of our church members. If you have not yet filled out an updated church directory information form you can pick one up at the church or contact the church office. We would like everyone to fill one out so that all of our information is up to date.

Once you have submitted your information to us you will need to start thinking about your photo. There are a few options on how to get your picture in the directory. One option is to have your photo taken here at the church on Sunday mornings or anytime during our office hours of 9 am to noon Monday through Thursday. The other options are to email a photo to the church office at worship@stlukenewton.com or upload your own photo directly into the church directory. Feel free to call or stop by the church office with any questions you may have. If you do choose to upload your own photo you will have to create an account before you will be able to do that. For those using your own photo here are some guidelines to follow: make sure it is a photo of only those listed in the directory, please make sure the photo is church appropriate and that the photo is a head shot close enough that we can clearly identify you and see your beautiful faces with no sunglasses on.

Once we have all your information added to the directory we will help you download the app, create an account and log in. Instant Church Directory - the program we are using to build our church directory - has a free app for church members to download on their Apple and Android devices.

To view the directory online, go to https:// members.instantchurchdirectory.com/ and follow the prompts under "Sign In" to "Create a login now." You will use your email address listed in the directory to create a log-in the first time you use the directory online and via the mobile app. You will also be asked to create a password. If your email address isn't listed in the directory yet, let the church office know so it can be added. Once you enter your email address follow the directions on screen to complete the login process. Please remember, you must confirm your email address before you can sign in. Anytime updates are made, they will update on your device automatically. In the app you will be able to search for families and members and call, email and text right from the app. You will also be able to update your information or photo at any time. Please note any changes or photos uploaded will have to be approved by the church office before they will show in the directory.

We are hoping to get this completed by the end of October. If you have any questions or need help you can contact Pastor Chad or the church office. We hope you enjoy our new online directory!

MISSIONARY-

An important part of missions is prayerfully supporting the church. Use this activity to guide your family's prayer time.

What you need:

- Plastic bag (large zippered)
- Permanent marker
- Bandage
- Toy plane
- Heart-shaped drawing or toy
- Spoon
- Coin
- Hot-sauce packet

What you do:

- 1. Label the bag with details about the missionaries you'll be praying for (names, location, specific needs).
- 2. Add small prayer-prompt objects to guide your prayer time (bandage = health, plane = travel, heart = relationships, spoon = cultural connection, coin = finances, hot sauce = boldness).
- 3. Include other objects that will prompt prayer for missionaries' specific needs.
- 4. Place the bag where it will remind your family to pray regularly.

I spoke God's message when the temple was being built. (My book is #37.)




