My Story



The squeak of tennis shoes on a gym floor and the sound of balls being dribbled down the court bring a smile to my face. As a teenager, this time of year meant basketball season was in full swing. I loved playing basketball and thankfully, I was able to play girls 6 on 6

ball. I was and continue to be a lousy shot! If I had been forced to attempt to make baskets, I would have been a bench warmer. Instead I was able to play defense only. I worked hard at keeping the offense player assigned to me, away from the basket, away from rebounds and hopefully away from the ball all together.

During the 6 on 6 basketball era, players focused on one part of the game. There were some who played both ends of the court, but most of us were specialized. As a guard, my role was to stop our competitors from scoring or at least to reduce the number of baskets they made during the game. At practice we focused on strengthening our legs so that we could move quickly. We worked on tracking our opponent and on making quick, accurate passes. Oh, and when we dribbled the ball, we were actually going somewhere. At the same time, our forwards were working on practicing free throws, layups, and jump shots, among other things.

Both ends of the court needed to work well as a team of three. But we also needed to work well as a team of 6 if we were to win any games.



The Adult 2 Sunday School class is reading and discussing the book Barking to the Choir: The Power of Radical Kinship by Gregory Boyle. If you are familiar



with Tattoos on the Heart or The Whole Language, you will enjoy reading Gregory Boyle's 2nd book in this series. In a nation deeply divided and plagued by poverty and violence, Barking to the Choir offers a snapshot into the challenges and joys of life on the margins. Sergio, arrested at age nine, in a gang by age twelve, and serving time shortly thereafter, now works with

the substance-abuse team at Homeboy to help others find sobriety. Jamal, abandoned by his family when he tried to attend school at age seven, gradually finds forgiveness for his schizophrenic mother. New father Cuco, who never knew his own dad, thinks of a daily adventure on which to take his four-year-old son. These former gang members uplift the soul and reveal how bright life can be when filled with unconditional love and kindness.

If you are looking for a class with variety and topical studies, this would be a good class for you. We read the book together, so there is no "homework". There is always room for more to join the conversation. We meet in Room 5 in the education wing right after Worship.




