



Midwest Mission Trip to Jefferson, IA October 2023

On Tuesday, October 24 a team of 12 traveled 2 hours to the new Midwest Mission location in Jefferson, Iowa to volunteer for the day. They took a trunkful of donations from St. Luke that included 832 diapers and components of school and personal dignity kits.



5 volunteers worked all day cutting and typing strips of plastic bags which are called plarn—plastic yard. These strips are woven on a loom into sleeping mats for the homeless. Our volunteers spent the afternoon weaving those mats. It is like making potholders on a loom which some of you may remember. The personnel at Midwest Mission would like to place looms in communities so this project can be ongoing.

7 volunteers spent the morning checking and repacking school kits sent from churches around Iowa. We prepared 27 boxes of 10 school kits and packed them in cardboard boxes. Midwest Mission is working on sending 10,000 school kits to the Caribbean. We got 270 ready to be shipped.

2 volunteers assisted the coordinator in emptying a trailer of medical supplies, inventorying them, and putting them in a larger trailer for transport to Illinois.

The afternoon was spent either cutting plann or weaving mats. 2 sleeping mats were completed.





Our diaper project has been going on for 6 years and this last contribution is only 46 diapers short of making and contributing 10,000 diapers. We were afraid to mention this when we realized it on Sunday. We thought someone would make us sew those 46 diapers before Tuesday. But we will celebrate the next time we gather to make diapers when we hit the 10,000 mark. If you would like to contribute to the diaper flannel fund we would welcome that. Mark your checks flannel or give your contribution to Barb Kaldenberg or Karen Clark.

Thank you for your continued generosity to these mission projects. If you are interested in volunteering consider getting a group together to spend the day in Jefferson. They do have housing at the Jefferson United Methodist Church if you want to spend the night and work 2 days.




