My Story

The December I was 5 years old, I spent a part of the month in the hospital. I came home right before Christmas, but when it was time to head to worship on Christmas Eve, my parents decided I should stay home. My sister, Kamela, stayed home with me. We spent that time, laying on the couch, watching the stop motion Christmas special, *The Little Drummer Boy*.

When you think about it, the little drummer boy is a strange concept... a little boy playing his drum for Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus. I mean, who really wants a drum solo when they are trying to get their infant to sleep? The story, however, is more than a drum solo. The story is of the transformation of a little boy who has lost a lot to tragedy and struggle, before meeting the magi caravan that is following the star toward Bethlehem. In the end, the little drummer boy learns gratitude and his only gift is his drumming ability, so he shares that with the holy family.

This story demonstrates an important concept for faith expression, we may not have the same abilities that others have to express our faith and gratitude. However, each of us has a gift to share with Jesus. Each of us can show our love for our Messiah through our talents. Each of us can honor Jesus this Christmas season, in our words, our deeds, our gifts and our spirit.

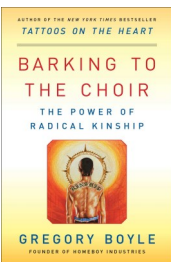
So the question for each of us remains... What gift will you bring to the King?

Adult-2 Sunday School Class

The Adult 2 Sunday School class is reading and discussing the book *Barking to the Choir: The Power of Radical Kinship* by Gregory Boyle. If you are familiar with *Tattoos on the Heart* or *The Whole Language*, you will enjoy reading Gregory Boyle's 2nd book in this series.



In a nation deeply divided and plagued by poverty and violence, *Barking to the Choir* offers a snapshot into the challenges and joys of life on the margins. Sergio, arrested at age nine, in a gang by age twelve, and serving time shortly thereafter, now works with the substance-abuse team at Homeboy to help others find sobriety.

Jamal, abandoned by his family when he tried to attend school at age seven, gradually finds forgiveness for his schizophrenic mother. New father Cuco, who never knew his own dad, thinks of a daily adventure on which to take his four-year-old son. These former gang members uplift the soul and reveal how bright life can be when filled with unconditional love and kindness.

If you are looking for a class with variety and topical studies, this would be a good class for you. We read the book together, so there is no "homework". There is always room for more to join the conversation. We meet in Room 5 in the education wing right after Worship.



God With Us in Our Dreams

Matthew 1:18-25

Celebrating Joseph's trust and faithfulness in fulfilling his role in the story of God's saving love

The book of Luke tells of Jesus's birth, originating from **Mary's** perspective, when she received a message from the angel Gabriel that she would conceive and give birth to a son, Jesus. The book of Matthew begins the story from the perspective of **Joseph** and *his dream*.

Not wanting to publicly disgrace the pregnant woman to whom he was engaged, he decided to break the engagement quietly. *As he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream. "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. For the child within her was conceived by the Holy Spirit..." All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet*

(Isaiah 7:14): *The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel (which means 'God is with us').* There are other Biblical versions stating Joseph was instructed to name the child Jesus, which means *the Lord saves*.



Some have considered how Jesus has been called *the Son of David*, given his biological lineage via Mary, and *not* a traditionally literal descendent of King David. Matthew 1:1-19 delineates the family tree of Jesus, descending from Abraham. It is in this (lengthy) "family tree" that David, son of Jesse, and father of Solomon, finally leading to Joseph, is exhibited. Without Joseph's becoming betrothed to Mary the prophesy foretold by Isaiah (7:14) would not come to fruition.

The Seasons of the Spirit Bible Study Class meets Sunday mornings, after the 9:30 church service. To honor and respect all present we are immunized. The class's emphasis is on the weekly lectionary readings. Prepare yourself for each week's passages!

Advent/ Christmas Offering for Christ's Foundry UMC

I asked Marian Spaur to give me some insight into Christ's Foundry UMC as someone who has attended worship there. She shared several bits of information and thoughts about this missionary congregation in Dallas, Texas.



Besides being a United Methodist congregation, this church and St Luke have similar beginnings. Christ's Foundry, like St Luke, did not have a building of their own when their story began nearly 20 years ago. Their ministry began in the founding pastor's home. Their next location was a gathering space in an apartment complex. Soon they had outgrown that space and another UM congregation invited them to worship in their church building.

On Christmas Eve 2011, they had their first worship service in their OWN space. Marianne was there to celebrate with them and to witness this very special worship service. She choked up when she described the emotions displayed by the congregation that Christmas Eve. She said people were hugging, laughing, crying and praising God for the gift of their own space for worship.



This Hispanic congregation continues to praise God for this gift today. As well as being grateful for generous people and congregations, both near and far, who support this missionary congregation. Our support allows this congregation to meet needs within their community, and allows them to praise God as a body of faith.

February 2023 MMDC Trip

Midwest Mission Distribution Center (MMDC) is located in central Illinois. It is packed full of a wide variety of mission projects and is powered by volunteers. St. Luke will be sending a team of volunteers February 5-8, 2023 and you could be one of those workers. In the past some of our team has worked in the wood shop area, making school desks from discarded gym bleachers. Some of us have assembled kits



such as layette kits the go to new mothers and hold clothing and diapers for newborn babies. We have assembled cleaning buckets, a 5 gallon bucket filled with cleaning supplies that aid those in areas hit with floods and storms. We have even had a person work in the sewing machine shop helping to clean and repair sewing machines that are donated to help support families. These projects and so many more are sent near the center and around the world to those in need. Christ is at the center of these projects and the stories that can be told of networking to make it all happen are miraculous. We stay in a dorm on site and eat meals together which we prepare in the dorm kitchen. We enjoy fellowship as we eat, worship, and play games.
